TAXES ARE DUE, WITH THIS NOTICE IN CANADIAN FUNDS. **There is a charge for US Funds** the US\$ is .98 to the Canadian \$ (i.e. bill is \$100 and you send US Funds then divide the amount by .98 (100/.98 = \$102.04 US to equal \$100 Canadian we reserve the right to change this rate should the US \$ increase or decrease). We charge 4% above the day of deposit rate. The tax due date for this year is July 27, 2010. Penalty at the rate of 1.25% per month or fraction thereof is added to outstanding taxes on the 1st day of each month. Payments are to be made payable to TOWNSHIP OF LAKE OF THE WOODS. For those with CIBC or Credit Union telephone banking (we are looking into other banks for this service as well) you can pay under "LAKE OF THE WOODS TOWNSHIP TAX" you must use your tax account number i.e. T00018, K0418, L00218 or M00256.

The total tax rates are reduced from 2009 to pass through the reduction in education rates residential rate is .00744000 which is less than the tax rate in place since 2004. Commercial & other rates have reduced as well. **2010 is a reassessment year and your actual taxes may be higher or lower due to a change in your assessment. Schedule 3 Capping Reports for Capped Class are not included as all properties are at their CVA tax rate.**

IMPROVEMENTS TO EFFICIENCY AND EFFECTIVENESS

- 1) Continued to update fire fighting equipment and training of personnel adding a new water storage tank for quick filling of the tanker truck.
- 2) We continue to updated our municipal website (www.lakeofthewoods.ca)
- 3) Completed asset valuation and policies and procedures for PSAB reporting requirements and update financial statement accordingly.
- 4) Kept to zero the days on non-compliance at our two landfill sites.
- 5) Worked with the Town of Fort Frances to improve our fire department records and training.
- 6) Continued work on our new waterfront water park and recreation area with financial assistance from the Federal & Provincial Governments.
- 7) With infrastructure funding provided by the Federal & Provincial Government 3 roads and our waterfront park were improved.
- 8) Started discussions with Rainy River and Dawson to see if a joint fire chief & integrated fire services could lead to efficiencies.

BARRIERS TO EFFICIENCY AND EFFECTIVENESS

- 1) Provincial downloading continues to put pressure on local services because of funding requirement's to pay the downloaded services.
- 2) Provincial reporting requirements, consuming time and resources along with new requirements for PSAB standards continued to increase the work load and decrease staff efficiencies.
- 3) Lack of funding to complete local needs, District Social Services Board is requiring an every increasing amount of funding.
